## Format





An intermediate Oxford format debate consisting of two teams, each with two members- one team being the proposition and the other team being the opposition. The debate opens with speeches from the proposition, followed by the opposition. This is followed by a refutation round where both teams respond to the arguments presented by the other. The debate then moves into the closing statements, starting with the opposition and concluding with the proposition.

- Each team designates one member to deliver the opening speech and the other, the closing speech.
- The proposition begins the debate with their opening speech which is followed by the opposition's opening speech.
- The opposition raises the first point in the refutation round.
- The final 30 seconds of the refutation round are reserved for the concluding statement- a clear concise summary of the teams arguments.
- The debate is concluded by the closing speech, first from the opposition and then the proposition.
- No new points may be introduced in the closing speech.








- If a certain team does bring up a new point; the opposition may request the moderator an opportunity to point out the new points at the end of the closing speech which will lead to a negative marking.
- Personal comments of any kind directed against the opposite team are strictly prohibited.
- Participants cannot comment on the opposite team's stance or statements made in previous competition debates.
- Please note that only handwritten materials will be allowed during the debate. Printed material will not be permitted.





- Participants will be judged on the following criteria: Analysis, confidence, engagement with opposition, organization of points, argumentation level and rapport established with partner.
- Discrepancies of any sort during the debate will be resolved at the moderator's discretion. The decision will be final and binding.
- All electronic devices are strictly prohibited during the debate.
- Note: The topic for the first and second round of debate (League Round 1 and 2) will be given one week prior to the debate. In the next rounds (League Round 3), the topics will be given 30 minutes prior to the debate.
- For the quarters, semi-finals and the finals the topics will be given one hour prior.







### **League Rounds and Quarter-Finals**

- 4 minutes for opening and closing speech.
- Warning bell after 3 minutes 45 seconds (1 bell).
- No new points can be introduced after the warning bell for the opening speaker.
- A contestant can however complete his current points and summarize. 2 bells after 4 minutes are completed.
- Contestants are expected to conclude in the next 15 seconds. He/she would not be allowed to speak after 4 min 15 seconds.
- The time for the refutation rounds is 10 minutes.

### **Semi-Finals and Finals**

- 5 minutes for opening and closing speech.
- Warning bell after 4 minutes 45 seconds (1 bell).
- No new points can be introduced after the warning bell for the opening speaker.
- A contestant can however complete his current points and summarize. 2 bells after 5 minutes are completed.
- Contestants are expected to conclude in the next 15 seconds. He/she will not be allowed to speak after 5 min 15 seconds.
- The time for the refutation rounds is 15 minutes for the semifinals and 20 minutes for the final.

- 3 League rounds
- Quarter- Finals
- Semi-Finals
- Final
- Structure of the Rounds:

All the rounds of the debate will be oxford style and will comprise of formal debating with the following format specifics

### **League Rounds:**

- Opening proposition speaker: 4 minutes
- Opening opposition speaker: 4 minutes
- Refutation Round : 10 minutes
- Concluding proposition speaker: 4 minutes
- Concluding opposition speaker : 4 minutes

### **Quarter Finals:**

- Opening proposition speaker: 4 minutes
- Opening opposition speaker: 4 minutes
- Refutation Round: 10 minutes
- Concluding proposition speaker: 4 minutes
- Concluding opposition speaker : 4 minutes







- Opening proposition speaker: 5 minutes
- Opening opposition speaker: 5 minutes
- Refutation Round: 15 minutes
- Concluding proposition speaker: 5 minutes








- There will be a registration fee of Rs. 400/-.
